Rule 18. Definitions

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The following terms, wherever used in this Tariff, have the following meaning unless otherwise clearly stated.

Actual Cost: The cost incurred for labor and materials, including overhead allocations, to complete a line extension or an addition to or modification of facilities.

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Advance for Construction: Money provided to the Association by a Member for a line extension or service connection, the value of which may be refundable by the Association.

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Ancillary Services: Those services that are necessary to support the transmission of capacity and energy from resources to loads while maintaining reliable operation of the Association's Transmission System in accordance with Good Utility Practice.

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Applicant: A person or legal entity requesting Electric Service or Transmission Service from the Association.

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Application for Electric Service: A written request for Electric Service in a form approved by the Association.

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Application for Transmission Service: A written request for Transmission Service by an Eligible Transmission Customer in a form approved by the Association pursuant to the provisions of this Tariff. (See also Completed Application definition.)

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

Rule 18. Definitions (continued)

Approved Renewable Resource Electric Generation Facility: An electric generation facility using water, biomass, geothermal waste, wind, or solar resources to generate power that has satisfied the terms and conditions of this Tariff. Electric generation facilities using other renewable resources may be evaluated by the Association for inclusion in the experimental program on a case-by-case basis.

Association: Golden Valley Electric Association, Inc.

Billing Date: The date bills for Electric Service are rendered and the date upon which payment for Electric Service is due and payable.

Billing Period: An interval of about one (1) month between successive meter readings or estimation of usage, and rendition of a bill (except for beginning or final billing periods).

Commission: The Regulatory Commission of Alaska.

Completed Application: An Application for Electrical Service or Transmission Service that satisfies all of the information and other requirements of this Tariff, including any required Deposit.

Rule 18. Definitions (continued)

Contribution-in-Aid of Construction: A cash payment made by an Applicant to the Association for the costs of the electric facilities which exceed the allowance for electric facilities provided by the Association under this tariff, the value of which is not refundable by the Association.

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Curtailment: A reduction in Transmission Service by the Association in response to a transmission capacity shortage due to system reliability conditions or other emergent conditions.

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Deferred Payment Agreement: An agreement between the Association and Member under which the Member agrees to pay certain amounts over an agreed time period.

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Delinquent or Delinquency: Any payment not received by the Association within forty (40) days of the original Billing Date. (See also, Past Due.)

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Delivering Party: The entity supplying capacity and energy to be transmitted at Point(s) of Receipt.

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Demand: The highest average rate of energy use in any fifteen (15) minute period during a Billing Period.

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Deposit: Money paid to the Association by a Member and held by the Association and to be returned to the Member to the extent the requirements for refund are met.

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

Designated Agent: Any entity, or person, that performs actions or functions on behalf of the Association or an Eligible Transmission Customer required under this Tariff.

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Direct Assignment Facilities: Facilities or portions of facilities that are constructed by the Association for the sole use and/or benefit of a particular Eligible Transmission Customer requesting service under this Tariff. Direct Assignment Facilities shall be specified in the Service Agreement that governs service to the Eligible Transmission Customer.

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Due Date: The last date payment for Electric Service can be received by the Association before Member's account is considered Past Due and subject to incurring a fee for late payment. See Rate Schedule M – Schedule of Deposits, Charges and Fees.

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Electric(al) Service: The availability of electric energy at the Point of Delivery for use by the Member, regardless of whether the electric energy is actually used by the Member.

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Electric Service Commencement Date: The date the Association begins to provide Electric Service pursuant to the terms of an executed Electric Service Contract, or the date the Association begins to provide Electric Service in accordance with this Tariff.

Electric Service Contract: An agreement between the Association and a Member that specifies a minimum monthly payment to be made by the Member to the Association to help offset the cost of construction of electrical Facilities by the Association to provide the Member Electric Service.

Electric Service Specifications: The specifications under which the Association will provide Electric Service to Eligible Transmission Customers, SNAP Producers, and Members owning small-scale renewables, and allow interconnection with its energy delivery system.

Eligible Transmission Customer: Any electric utility (including the Association) or any person generating electric energy for resale that holds a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity from the Commission or is otherwise exempt from Commission certification under state or federal law, and is, or becomes a Member, for purposes of Transmission Service under this tariff (or a Designated Agent) that executes a Service Agreement with the Association for Transmission Service.

Estimated (Construction) Costs: The Association's estimate of the cost of labor, materials, and overhead to complete a line extension or addition of facilities or Direct Assignment Facilities. The Association strives to make good faith estimates that are within plus or minus ten percent (10%) of actual cost. However, contractor availability, weather, location and terrain conditions often make actual costs difficult to estimate accurately. See Section 7.07 (Construction Cost Estimates).

Expedited Transmission Service Agreement: The agreement between the Association and an Eligible Transmission Customer which provides the terms and conditions under which an Eligible Transmission Customer can expedite their ability to obtain Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service by agreeing to compensate the Association for all costs associated with processing the request. See Section 16.5(h) (Expedited Procedures for New Facilities).

Experimental Renewable Resource Purchase Program: The program established by the Association, on an experimental basis, to purchase power from Members that own and operate renewable resource generation facilities at a nameplate capacity rating greater than that allowable under Sustainable Natural Alternative Power (SNAP) program but under a nameplate capacity rating which does not exceed 2,000 kW. The program has been established in order to provide the Association with data regarding the effect of such generation on its utility system.

Facilities: All primary distribution systems, equipment, and plant capable of handling over 600 volts.


Facilities Study (Transmission): An engineering study by the Association or its designee conducted in accordance with the methodologies set forth in Rule 16 (Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service) to determine the required modifications to the Association's Transmission System, including the cost and scheduled completion date for such modifications, that will be required to provide the requested Transmission Service. The cost of a Facilities Study is the responsibility of the party requesting Transmission Service.

Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service: The reservation and transmission of capacity and energy on a firm basis that is reserved and/or scheduled between specified Points of Receipt and Delivery pursuant to Rule 16 (Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service). "On a firm basis" shall mean that service by the Association will only be interrupted for *force majeure* events, system emergencies, or Curtailments.

Fuel and Purchased Power Adjustment: The Rate that reflects the amount charged for the cost of fuel to generate power and the cost to purchase power.

Generation Interconnection Agreement: The interconnection agreement separately executed between an owner of generation and the Association providing for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Association interconnection facilities required to accommodate deliveries of the net output of a generation facility.


Good Utility Practice: Any of the practices, methods and acts engaged in or approved by a significant portion of the electric utility industry during the relevant time period, or any of the practices, methods and acts which, in the exercise of reasonable judgment in light of the facts known at the time the decision was made, could have been expected to accomplish the desired result at a reasonable cost consistent with good business practices, reliability, safety and expedition. Good Utility Practice is not intended to be limited to the optimum practice, method, or act to the exclusion of all others, but rather to be acceptable practices, methods, or acts generally accepted in the region.

Interruptible Power Service: Energy supplied by the Association on an interruptible basis under a Special Contract. The Special Contract will, at a minimum, include terms concerning the amount of power to be supplied, the Association's ability to interrupt the service, and the pricing for that level of service.

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Kilowatt (kW): A unit of electrical power equal to 1,000 watts.

Kilowatt-hour (kWh): Electric energy equivalent to the amount of electric energy delivered for a period of one (1) hour at a constant rate of one (1) kilowatt.

Large Generators: A generation resource on the Association's system with a capacity rating of greater than 100kW.

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Line Extension: The Facilities required to be installed by the Association to provide Electric Service to a new Point of Delivery.

Long-Term Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service: Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service with a term of one (1) year or more.

Master Meter: A meter used to record power supplied by the Association to a Member for the purpose of sub-metering and resale.

Member: A natural person or legal entity, including any firm, association, corporation, body politic, or subdivision thereof, that meets the requirements for membership in the Association.

Meter Tampering: The unpermitted alteration of or tampering with a meter by means such as bypassing a meter, using magnets to affect the meter's registration, breaking the meter's seals, or other such means intended to avoid the accurate registration of usage or Demand.

Minimum Deposit: An amount equal to the Association's current good faith estimate of an average residential bill for a single month. The Association may adjust the minimum deposit amount based on an annual review of the average monthly bill, but the minimum deposit will always correspond to an average bill for a single month.

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Native Load Customers: The wholesale and retail power customers (Members) of the Association on whose behalf the Association, by statute, franchise, regulatory requirement, or contract, has undertaken a priority obligation to construct and operate its system to meet the reliable electric needs of such customers.

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Network Upgrades: Facilities or a portion of facilities that are added or upgraded by the Association to the Transmission System in order to accommodate Eligible Transmission Customers' Transmission Service requests.

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Non-Firm Power Rate: The rate updated quarterly in an electric utility's tariff in accordance with 3 AAC 50.770(d), or established in a Commission-approved contract as described in 3 AAC 50.930(a)(2).

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Parties: The Association and the Transmission Customer receiving Transmission Service.

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Past Due: Any payment not received by the Association within twenty-five (25) days of the original Billing Date. (See also, Delinquent.)

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

Permanent Electric Service: Electric Service to a premise that will take such service permanently and continuously. The Association may use the following criteria to determine permanence: ownership or leasehold to the property by the Applicant, all weather access to the premises by standard four-wheel drive vehicle, a useful habitable structure attached to a suitable foundation, not capable of easily being moved to other locations, and with the intent that the facilities remain at a location for the useful service life of the facilities.

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Point(s) of Delivery: For Electric Service, the point where the Association's Facilities connect with the Member's equipment or conductors. For Transmission Service, the point(s) on the Association's Transmission System where capacity and energy transmitted by the Association will be made available to the Receiving Party. The Point(s) of Delivery shall be specified in the Service Agreement for Point-To-Point Transmission Service.

Point(s) of Receipt: For Transmission Service, point(s) of interconnection on the Association's Transmission System where capacity and energy will be made available to the Association by the Delivering Party. The Point(s) of Receipt shall be specified in the Service Agreement for Point-To-Point Transmission Service.

Primary Voltage: Electrical facilities energized at a voltage greater than 480 volts.

Qualifying Facility: A cogeneration facility or small power production facility as defined in the Commission's regulations at 3 AAC 50.820(11).

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Rate(s): The Association's Tariff charges for sales of energy in kilowatt-hours and Demand in kilowatts, including minimum charges and criteria for the assessment of charges for Electric Service.

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Rate Schedule: The Commission-approved Rates, charges, and terms that govern the amounts that the Association charges its Members for specific services.

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Real Power Loss(es): The normal loss of energy during transmission.

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Receiving Party: The entity receiving the capacity and energy transmitted by the Association to Point(s) of Delivery.

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Rendition of Bill: A bill for Electric Service that has been issued to a Member. A bill is rendered on the Billing Date shown on the bill.

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Reseller: The entity receiving rights under an agreement for Transmission Service as more fully described in Section 16.9 (Sale or Assignment of Transmission Service).

Reserved Capacity: The amount of capacity and energy that the Association agrees to transfer for the Eligible Transmission Customer over the Association's Transmission System between the Point(s) of Receipt and the Point(s) of Delivery. Reserved Capacity shall be expressed in terms of whole megawatts on a sixty (60) minute interval (commencing on the clock hour) basis.

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Seasonal Electric Service: The furnishing of Electric Service by the Association and the taking of Electric Service by a Member only during certain months. Prior to February 1, the Member shall elect between: (i) the months of November through March; (ii) the months of November through April for their reduced load period. Seasonal Service shall be considered Temporary Service for purposes of Extension of Facilities.

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Secondary Voltage: Electrical facilities energized at 480 volts or less.

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Service: The conductors and equipment for delivering electric energy from the Association to the wiring system of the premises served.

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Service Agreement for Point-To-Point Transmission Service (Service Agreement): For purposes of Transmission Service, the initial agreement and any amendments or supplements thereto entered into by the Eligible Transmission Customer and the Association for Transmission Service under this Tariff.

Service Drop: An overhead electrical line running from an Association utility pole, to a Member's building or other premises.

Service Territory Area: The Association's service territory allocation as authorized by the Commission.

Short-Term Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service: Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service with a term of less than one (1) year.

Single-Phase Electric Service: Electric Service using two (2) energized conductors and one (1) neutral conductor.

Special Contract: An agreement between the Association and a Member under which the Association agrees to provide Electrical Service not specifically addressed or otherwise provided for in this Tariff. A Special Contract may also be used to address an Advance for Construction, see 3 AAC 48.820(36). A Special Contract may also refer to a mutually agreeable contract between the Association and the QF entered in accordance with 3 AAC 50.770(h) and specify the charges, rates, terms, and conditions of interconnection, integration, purchases, and sales to the Association from the QF when appropriate.

Special Transmission Service Contract: A contract for Transmission Service entered into by an Eligible Transmission Customer and the Association setting forth the terms and conditions under which the Association will provide Transmission Service not specifically addressed or otherwise provided for in this Tariff, see 3 AAC 48.820(36).

Standby Electric Service: Service that a Member may elect to take in the form of Backup Power Service, Scheduled Maintenance Power Service, Supplemental Power Service, and/or Interruptible Power Service. The rates, terms, and conditions for Standby Service are located at Tariff Sheets Nos. 43 through 43.11.

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Subdivision: A tract or parcel of land divided into two or more lots, sites, or other divisions according to applicable law.

Substantial Portion (see Rate Schedule R): For purposes of this Tariff, a "Substantial Portion" shall mean more than one-fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the total floor area or more than one-fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) of electrical energy consumed or more than one-fourth ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the electrical demand.

Sustainable Natural Alternative Power (SNAP) Program: The programs established by the Association to promote the installation of Member-owned alternative power generation. SNAP Projects must have a capacity of 25 kW or less.

System Impact Study: An assessment by the Association, or its designee, of (i) the adequacy of the Transmission System to accommodate a request for Firm Point-To-Point Transmission Service; and (ii) whether any additional costs may be incurred in order to provide Transmission Service. The cost of any System Impact Study is the responsibility of the entity requesting Transmission Service.

Tariff: The entire body of Rules, Regulations, Schedules, Rates, and Charges governing the interaction of the Association and its Members as filed with the Commission.

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Temporary Electric Service: Electric Service to premises that the Association determines will not take Electric Service permanently and continuously. All Electric Service that does not qualify as Permanent Service shall be considered to be Temporary Electric Service.

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Third-Party Sale: Any sale for resale to a power purchaser.

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Three-Phase Electric Service: Electric Service using three (3) energized conductors and one (1) neutral conductor.

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Transmission Service: The Association's transport of electrical capacity and energy for an Eligible Transmission Customer under this Tariff, which also includes the provision of Ancillary Services.

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Transmission System: The facilities owned, controlled or operated by the Association at 69 kV or greater voltage that are used to provide Transmission Service. Whether an Eligible Transmission Customer requires the use of the Association's transmission lines 69 kV or greater or a transmission level transformer, will be the determining factor(s) of whether a person is using the Association's Transmission System for purposes of applying the terms of this Tariff.

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


