3.01	General Description and Standard Voltages	T
	The Association provides 60 cycle (Hertz) alternating current, either single or three phase, at available standard voltages specified by the Association depending upon available circuits and the Member's requirements. Voltage, frequency and wave form are regulated to conform to the standard practices of the industry.	T T
3.02	Association Provision of Electric Service	N
	The Association will construct, operate, and maintain all the Facilities necessary to deliver Electric Service to the Member's Point of Delivery, unless otherwise provided in this Tariff or by Special Contract. Responsibility for design, construction, operation and maintenance, and removal of Association's lines and other facilities shall rest with the Association unless otherwise agreed to in a contract.	T T
3.03	Point of Delivery of Electric Service	N
	(a) Overhead System	
	For an overhead system, the Point of Delivery of Electric Service is the point of connection at the Association's supply conductors and the Member's Service entrance conductors. This point must be outside the Member's building or other structure.	
	(b) Underground System	
	For an underground system, the Point of Delivery of Electric Service is at the secondary voltage service lugs of the transformer, secondary pedestal, or other structure to which the Association's supply conductors are connected. The conductors from the Association's equipment to the Member's meter and service entrance disconnect are the responsibility of the Member.

3.04 Types of Electric Service Offered T

(a) Permanent Electric Service T

(1) Permanent Electric Service installations are defined in Rule 18 (Definitions). Charges for construction of Permanent Electrical Facilities will be based on the policies set out in this Tariff. Where expenditures above the Association's normal limit are not required to provide Electric Service to the premises, the Association will, at its expense, provide the Facilities necessary to serve the Member. See Rule 7 (Extension of Facilities). N

(2) A Permanent Service is one that is expected to remain in continuous service. In evaluating whether a proposed Electrical Service is permanent, the Association will look to both the physical improvements on the property and the documented intentions of the Applicant for Electric Service.

Examples of physical improvements may include:

- Permanent structures that are part of the real property and that are listed on the local taxing jurisdiction's real property tax rolls,
- Permanent foundation of a type that is normally and customarily associated with permanent construction, such as poured reinforced concrete, driven metal pilings, all weather wood pilings, or sonotubes,
- The presence of water supply and sewage disposal facilities on the property is preferred but not required.

	(1) Temporary Electric Service installations are defined in Rule 18 (Definitions). Charges for construction of temporary Facilities will be based on the policies set out in this Tariff.	N
	(2) Where the duration of Temporary Electric Service is to be less than one (1) month, the Applicant will be required to advance a sum of money equal to the estimated bill for Service. Where the duration of Temporary Electric Service is to be more than one (1) month, the Applicant must meet the Association's deposit requirements. Temporary Electric Service may not continue longer than 12 months unless there is good cause for the extension or the Member has made an application for Permanent Electric Service.	N

	The Association shall provide Standby Service in the form of Backup Power Service, Scheduled Maintenance Power Service, Supplemental Power Service, and/or Interruptible Power Service. The rates, terms, and conditions for Standby Service are located at Tariff Sheets Nos. 43 through 43.11.	
	(e) Interruptible Electric Service	T
	Interruptible Electric Service is defined in Rule 18 (Definitions).	N
	The Association will furnish non-firm electrical energy, which service may be interrupted or terminated at the Association's discretion. Interruptible Power Service will be provided only under a Special Contract.

(f) Special Contracts

Special Contract is defined in Rule 18 (Definitions).

All Special Contracts required to be filed with the Commission are listed in Appendix II, Special Contract List.

3.05 Interconnection with System

(a) Interconnection with Qualifying Facility (Cogenerator or Small Power Producer)

The Association will not interconnect with a Qualifying Facility unless the following safety standards are met, including:

- (1) The Qualifying Facility must conform to the edition of the National Electric Code adopted under AS 18.60.580.
- (2) The Qualifying Facility must provide a means of electronically disconnecting from a remote location with provisions for padlocking in the open position by the Association. This device, or a supplementary device, must be capable of switching under full load conditions and must be clearly labeled and accessible to Association personnel.

3.05 Interconnection with System (continued)

(a) Interconnection with Qualifying Facility (Cogenerator or Small Power Producer) (continued)

(3) The Qualifying Facility must provide overcurrent protection of adequate interrupting capacity and design for the feeder serving as the intertie to the Association's system in conformance with the Association's overcurrent practices for similar feeders and loads. Automatic reclosing by the Qualifying Facility is prohibited unless the Qualifying Facility has received prior written approval from the Association as not posing a threat to life or property.

(4) Upon request, the Association may provide overcurrent protection in accordance with its overcurrent practices for similar feeders and loads for the feeder extension serving as the intertie to a Qualifying Facility pursuant to a Special Contract.

(b) Interconnection with SNAP or SNAP Plus Generation

The Association will interconnect with SNAP or SNAP Plus generation facilities pursuant to the terms and conditions of Section 6.18 SNAP Project Requirements of this Tariff.

- (d) Interconnection with Large Generators



Every Member operating a large generator will need to enter into a Generation Interconnection Agreement with the Association incorporating the Non-Power Producer Generation GVEA Interconnection Specifications.
